Additional tuition deposit changes

Last month [we informed you](#) about our tuition deposit payment changes — this month we have new updates.

Applicants can now request to transfer their tuition deposit to another program or term *within the same academic year*. Applicants may also be eligible to have their [tuition deposit refunded](#) under the following circumstances:

- Admission requirements are not met: conditionally accepted applicants who do not meet the minimum admission requirements by the transcript deadline — or have had their offer rescinded based on anticipated final grades — may be eligible for a refund of their tuition deposit less the \$250 administration fee.
- Study permit denied: international applicants whose study permit is denied by Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC) may be eligible for a refund of their tuition deposit less a \$250 administration fee.
