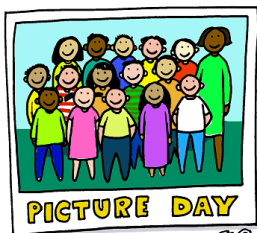

Program Donation Request - Dear Parents/Guardians:

While schools are provided with a budget for basic education, programming enrichment has to be funded in other ways. For example, the following are things that are not covered by the basic education budget but that add to your student's educational experience and learning:

The Good Food Box is a program under the Community Kitchen Program of Calgary whereby you can purchase fresh fruits and vegetables at amazing costs.. The more people that join in the program the greater our buying power becomes. They offer ALL Calgarians access to nutritious food to ensure no one goes hungry. The Fruit and Vegetable boxes are put together and delivered to your closest location (Hub) once a month.

As the Pearson Hub continues to grow, we invite the community, your staff and students to participate and join us using program.

As a Community Outreach Worker, I provide ongoing, long-term support to individuals, families, couples, men, women, etc. The purpose of my support is to help individuals/families achieve their goals which lead to a positive impact on their livelihoods. The Community Outreach program is completely voluntary, and driven by the individual and what they would like to work on. I can meet with them in the community on a weekly, or bi-weekly basis.
