School Examinations - *Student Examination Rules*

General Rules

1. Arrival time

Students must arrive at the school 30 min prior to your scheduled exam start time. Find your exam on the board in the Main Foyer or in the Cafeteria. Teachers and Administrators will be available to answer any questions you may have. Students will be allowed into the exam 15 minutes prior to the start of the exam.

2. Admittance to the Examination Room

Students may not enter or leave the examination room without the consent of the supervising examiner. *If you need to leave the room, put your hand up and wait for a teacher to come to your desk. If you finish before the end of the exam, put your hand up and wait for a teacher to check your materials (and clear your calculator) before you leave. No admission to the exam will be granted to students who arrive more than one hour after the exam has started.*

3. Exam Accommodations

Students that require accommodations due to an IPP/Learning code or through ESL will be writing exams in Room 1127.

4. Student Identification

Students will not be permitted to enter the exam room until they present identification that includes their photograph. All students must carry their student ID card with them. If you do not have your school ID, you will need to go to the main office to buy a new ID card at the cost of \$5.

5. Writing Time

Students must write their examination within the specified time and may not hand in a paper until at least one hour of the examination time has elapsed.

6. Discussion

Students should not ask a supervising teacher questions about their examination unless the examination booklet is incomplete or difficult to read. Students may not talk, whisper, or exchange information with one another.

7. Answer Sheets (if Multiple Choice)

Students should use an HB pencil to record their answers on the Scantron answer sheets.

8. Materials Not Allowed

Students must not have the following items in their possession during the examination:

Electronic devices (except approved calculators), including cellular telephones, mp3 players and other listening devices, PDAs, electronic/print dictionaries, thesauruses and translators. *Print dictionaries/thesauruses are permitted only in the written exams (English, SS, and FLA)*

1. *Wearable technology i.e. Apple Watches*
2. Purses, bags, pencil cases, calculator covers, and other containers
3. outside coats
4. any drink containers (bottles, cans or cups) with labels

All non-essential materials should be left in student lockers or at home.

9. Materials Not to be Removed from the Examination Room

Students are not allowed to remove materials from the examination room, besides those that they brought in. This includes any scrap paper.

10. When you are Finished Your Examination

Raise your hand and wait for a teacher to come to your desk to verify that all is in order before you leave.

11. Student lounges/Cafeteria

The cafeteria and student lounges will be used for study purposes only. This space must be quiet for the students in the school who are writing. If you do not have an exam you are encouraged to stay at home.



12. Textbook Return

Students must return required textbooks no later than the day of the exam. Textbook return will take place in the Library Foyer and Business Office. Textbook return will open 30 min prior to the exam.

13. If you have a conflict with another exam, please identify those conflicts to Mrs. Reynolds and Mrs. Gordon in the main office prior to June 2, 2017.

Possible Consequences

Students are expected to comply with the *Examination Rules*. Students who copy another student's work, share work or 'cheat' in any other way, disrupt other students, or who in other ways do not follow these rules:

- ✓ be evicted from the examination room;
- ✓ receive a grade of 'zero' on their final examination;
- ✓ be withdrawn from the course; and / or
- ✓ be suspended from school.

DIPLOMA IN PRACTICAL NURSING FALL 2018 DEADLINES

Applications to Practical Nursing for Fall 2018 will be accepted between **August 1, 2017 at 8am** until **August 31, 2017 at 4pm** both [in-person](#) and [online](#). We strongly recommend that learners apply online. Late applications will not be considered.

After learners apply, they will then have until **mid-September** to submit their proof of enrolment from their high school. This process improvement ensures that your learners are *not* disadvantaged in their final high school year.

Applicants who are enrolled in high school or upgrading should request their school send an interim transcript and current enrolments to our college via email (admissions@bowvalleycollege.ca) or fax (403-297-4887).

Candidates will be prioritised in the order their **application** (not transcript) was received, on a first applied, first admitted basis. The minimum high school academic requirements are:

- English Language Arts 30-1 (60%) or 30-2 (70%)
 - Math 20-1 (50%) or 20-2 (60%)
 - Biology 30 (60%)

Dear CBE Parents and Guardians,

It has been a busy school year. Since September the CBE has opened 15 new schools and 2 replacement schools throughout the city. This is the largest system-wide opening of schools we have ever experienced. We eagerly anticipated the opening of these new schools as they allow students to attend school closer to where they live and provide more flexibility with spaces in our system. Parents have told us that having schools closer to home is a priority and we appreciate the provincial commitments that were made in order to make these new schools possible.

Modernizing existing infrastructure is also essential to ensure that learning environments are responsive to student needs. We have recently completed two high school modernizations as well as opening the Aboriginal Learning Centre. We are currently working on another two high school modernizations.

Over the past year, the CBE also embarked in an Impacted School Engagement project with parents and communities affected by the new school openings. As new schools open up, space is created in those schools where the students had been attending, while there are still schools that are nearing, or are over, capacity. To optimize the learning spaces across the system, the CBE managed an extensive public engagement process using our new public engagement framework, called Dialogue. We worked with communities around proposed changes to program locations, student designations and grade configurations. The lessons we learned this year will inform the work that continues next year and our continued dialogue with you in the future.

We, the trustees at the Calgary Board of Education would like to thank all of our families across the city. Your patience and support has been appreciated during this entire process.

For those strong voices who advocated for the new schools we are opening and for the modernization of existing facilities, thank you! Your voices have helped us provide excellent public education opportunities throughout our city.

For those staff, families and students in school communities that accommodated a "school within a school" for part of the year, thank you! You played a critical role in supporting staff and students to make this transition period as successful as possible.

For those parents who are part of our school councils, thank you! Your leadership to inspire and motivate parents to be involved in every step was important for the success of these projects. To the parents and community members who have volunteered countless hours to name new schools and set up new school councils and fundraising societies, your work is greatly valued by all of us.

For the thousands of parents who participated in and continue to participate in our many engagement projects, thank you! We know change can be challenging. By working together, you have helped us make decisions in the best interests of students.
