Exam Rules for LBP Students

- Students must arrive and be **seated quietly in their exam area 15 minutes** prior to the start of the exam
- Students must present **school or picture ID** for entrance into the exam area
- **Students may not bring any cell phones, smart watches, headsets, IPODS or any other type of electronic devices into the examination room.** No hand-held electronic dictionaries and electronic or paper templates and/or graphic organizers are allowed. Only Alberta Education approved calculators are permitted for the Math and Science exams.
- Any student in possession of material not allowed in an examination room will have his/her mark invalidated
- No hats or jackets are allowed in the exam area
- Students may not enter or leave the examination room without the consent of the supervising examiner
- For diploma exams, students must not write their name or the name of their school anywhere in or on an examination booklet, except in the designated space provided on the back cover
- **Students who arrive more than one hour after the start time of an examination will not be allowed to write the exam**
- Students must write the examination within the specified time and may not hand in a paper until at least one hour of the examination time has elapsed. Additional writing time as an accommodation will only apply if a student has been recommended and approved for that accommodation
- Students may not discuss the examination with a supervisor unless the exam booklet is incomplete or illegible.
- Students may not talk, whisper or exchange information or writing tools/materials with another student
- Students should use an HB pencil to record their answers on the machine scored answer sheets. Use Pen for handwriting ELA, Social and FLA Part A exams
- Students who bring authorized materials in the examination room are responsible for ensuring that these materials are completely free of notes or other prohibited material
- Students may not bring any papers, notes of any kind, or books (other than authorized resources) into the examination room
- Students may not remove any examinations or examination materials from the examination room. This includes tear-out pages in diploma exam booklets and any rough draft material produced by students writing their Part A exam using a computer.

Breaches of security for Diploma Examinations

Students are expected to comply with the Non Diploma/Diploma Examination Rules. Students who interfere with the security of examinations, falsify results, disrupt others, or commit any other act that may enable them to inaccurately represent their achievement may:

1. be evicted from exam room
2. have exam invalidated
3. be barred from writing any other Alberta Education diploma
4. have official transcripts withheld
5. have official transcripts annotated

Exam Conflict?

Writing two exams on the same day does **not** necessarily generate an exam conflict.

In the event a student does experience two exams being written at the same time, the higher level exam is written first. (i.e.) The 30 level exam takes priority over a 20 level exam. When students take a combination of 10, 20 and/or 30 level courses, it is impossible to generate an exam schedule with zero exam conflicts.
